

STUDY PROGRAMS AT FACULTY OF MATHEMATICS AND PHYSICS (FMF)

We offer several programs at various levels, as specified here:

At the Master level, we do not always offer the same courses for two consecutive years, though several courses are offered every other year. The exact list of courses for the forthcoming year is typically determined later in the Spring Semester.

At the doctoral level we often offer two or three courses per year. They can be in English and carry 6 ECTS.

Independently of whether one studies for the bachelor's or master's degree, they may take courses at both levels, provided that their local coordinator permits it. Master-level students may also take courses at the doctoral level. Each course requires an appropriate background.

LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION AND EXAMINATION

Our courses may be held either:

- a) in Slovenian
- b) in Slovenian with adjustments for foreign students
- c) in English.

Courses at the Bachelor level are taught in Slovenian. For Slovenian courses in general, it is the lecturer that decides between options a) and b). While taking Slovenian courses (option a)) may be feasible, in such a case the students should be prepared to manage on their own the risks associated with the language barrier.

Option b) entails:

- consultations and exams in English, and
- list of pertinent literature in English, and
- either
 - * available lecture notes in English, or
 - * previously recorded lectures in English, or
 - * simultaneous translation into English by means of personal applications.

A list of available courses shall be posted on the faculty website.

COURSES AT OTHER FACULTIES

Erasmus students at FMF may also take courses at other faculties or departments within University of Ljubljana, e.g., Computer Science (FRI) or Education (PF). However, a majority should be taken at the FMF. Each faculty or department may have its own specific set of regulations, e.g., regarding limitations pertaining to the number of attendees within a given course, the language of instruction, etc. Likewise, courses chosen at other faculties need to be approved by those faculties. APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

As a part of the Erasmus application, the student should submit:

- Learning Agreement (proposal of courses to be attended at the U. of Ljubljana); the option of signing documents via Online Learning Agreement is available;
- Transcript of records
- Language certificate
- a copy of ID.
